I want to thank you all for your incredible support in making RAC's vision a reality. The backing from the Committees and members has been truly inspiring. It's fantastic to see our membership numbers growing, new branches opening, and the difference we're making. This year has been tremendously successful with our events and weekend rides, even in winter weather. I am excited about expanding further and growing our reach even more throughout the coming year. Each and everyone of you plays a part in achieving this, and we couldn't do it without you.

Although R.A.C is all about raising funds for cancer related causes, R.A.C Welfare has been incorporated into what we do. This encompasses many things, from helping to support members and their whanau to thanking volunteers at the Cancer Society. Although the original vision did not include a casual support service, it became apparent early on that this is something R.A.C needed to include in future planning. Now we are developing a R.A.C Welfare team, with a Welfare Coordinator in each branch. This is not a medical advice role, but rather someone who can keep an eye on how our members are going, especially the ones going through a cancer journey.

This year was our first year to apply for funding through grants, and we received a \$2,000 grant from Eastern and Central Trust. This meant we were able to purchase a 6x3m gazebo for events in the Central region. Now we are able to provide our members with a sturdy shelter at each event and display the R.A.C merchandise without being concerned for the weather.

Our merchandise sales has seen a tremendous growth and the merchandise team are always on the lookout for new items to add value to this. We have seen the development of the Members-only R.A.C ring, as well as Supporters badges, and the ever popular F%@K CANCER items. Some of these items have been donated by local businesses, such as the small metal signs and keyrings.

Together we really are making a difference.

FINANCIAL HEALTH

This year has seen the financial growth of RAC increase dramatically. This has been due to a number of reasons, some of which are an increase in overall sponsorship received, and increases of 111% in sales of merchandise.

It is fantastic to see the hardwork put in by our Sponsorshp Co-Ordinator have such a major impact on lowering our operating expenses. We have been able to purchase a projector screen for use during events. Not only does this lift the professional look of R.A.C, it helps to get information out there about who we are. We also have our website operating expenses covered for the next two years, through the generous donation of a local business.

Overall we have seen an increase in most areas of revenue, meaning we have the ability to donate more of our funds in this coming year.

We continuously strive to find ways of ensuring our funds are put to the best use possible, and it has been exciting to see us be able to donate over \$29,000 to a variety of cancer related causes this year.

Such a large amount of donations has been possible due to the combined fundraising & sponsorship efforts of both Central & Canterbury. With our Southland branch now up and running, and having had their first event, I look forward to seeing that donation figure grow even larger.




